

1. **DOGS: Dogs are to be on a leash at all times and kept in the camping area. No dogs are allowed in the arena grandstands or stall areas.** Owners must clean up after their dogs.
2. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules of the current PtHA Rule book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Should any questions or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the show committee, whose decision will be final. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR TO KNOW THE RULES GOVERNING CLASSES.
3. All Pintos must be registered with PtHA. Owners/exhibitors must provide copies of PtHA registration papers for all Pintos entered in show. --**PtHA membership does not make you a member of Oregon Pinto Horse Association OR Southern Oregon Pinto Horse Association.** -- To become a member of those organizations and be eligible to compete for each club's year-end awards: OPtHA/Teresa Anderson – (253) 862-6461 or optha.membership@gmail.com

4. **All owners and exhibitors of Pintos entered in show must be current members of PtHA.** Owners/exhibitors must provide copy of current PtHA membership card with entry form. For leased Pintos, a current lease agreement must be on file with PtHA and a copy of lease agreement should be submitted with entry form. Lease agreements must be renewed through PtHA each year. It is owner/lessee responsibility to make sure all lease agreements are current and up to date prior to showing.
5. The owner of every miniature horse/pony in competition shall provide a copy of a current PtHA or approved outcross measurement card (ASPC, AMHR, AMHA) or be measured at the show before a back number will be issued. Shoeing regulations for horses will be enforced.
6. PROTESTS: Protests covering an occurrence within the horse show must be made in writing to the show committee within 12 hours of the cause of the protest. It must be signed by the protested and accompanied by a deposit of \$250.00. See PtHA rulebook.
7. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be in the paddock area PRIOR to the call of his/her class. A two minute gate hold will be allowed if prior notification has been given to gate manager.
8. COMBINING/CANCELLING CLASSES: Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes at their discretion if the number of entries in a class warrant. Classes with less than three entries may be cancelled or combined with other classes. In the event a class is cancelled, entry fees will be refunded. **Horse halter classes will not be combined regardless of the number of entries in the class. Pony and all Miniature Horse classes will be combined if less than three entries in the class.**
9. SPEAKING TO THE JUDGE: Exhibitors wishing to speak to the judges must make an appointment through the show committee.
10. UNATTENDED HORSES: Horses are not to be left unattended when outside the enclosure of a stall. All horses must be in a stall at night for the safety of the horses and exhibitors.
11. **STALLIONS: All exhibitors of stallions/colts must be 19 years and older. This is a PtHA rule.**
12. ALCOHOL: No alcoholic beverages are permitted in the show barns, arenas or paddock area. IN KEEPING WITH OREGON STATE LAW, NO ONE UNDER THE AGE OF 21 MAY CONSUME ANY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.

13. REFUNDS: Refunds will be made with a veterinarian's certificate provided the certificate is dated prior to the end of the show and postmarked within seven days after the show. Refunds will be made when management has cancelled a class. There will be NO REFUNDS for classes exhibitors/owners scratch or miss. Entry fees for a scratched class may be transferred to another class for the same owner at same show at the time of the scratch.

14. ENTRIES: All entries must be postmarked no later than June 20, 2010 to avoid post entry fees. PRE-Entry Incentive: You may send in your pre-entries without payment by June 20, 2010, provided you have paid and reserved a stall for each horse entered OR paid the haul-in fee for each horse entered. Payment for classes pre-entered is expected when you pick up your number at the show. Management reserves the right to accept entries for unfilled classes after the closing date at the regular fee.

15. HAUL-IN FEE: All horses not requiring stabling will be charged a haul-in fee of \$15.00 per horse.

16. STALLS: **NO STALL CHANGES** are to be made without prior consent of the Barn Manager. Arrivals prior to July 1 must make arrangements with stall manager – Annie Suratt (503) 313-3857.

17. **ALL AWARDS NEED TO BE PICKED UP IN THE SHOW OFFICE BY THE CLOSE OF THE SHOW, AWARDS WILL NOT BE MAILED OR DELIVERED.**

18. HIGH POINTS: All classes in respective divisions will count including halter. Color classes will not count. Ties will be broken first on the horse, youth/horse or amateur/horse combination earning greatest number of 1st places, then 2nd places, etc. If a tie remains, the winner will be the entrant who earned pts in the most classes. High points and Top 5 will be offered in the following categories:

Saddle/Pleasure Type Horse
Youth 14 – 18
Miniature
Novice Youth
Amateur Elite

Stock/Hunter Type Horses
Jr. Amateur
Miniature B
Youth Walk/Trot

Youth 13 & Under
Sr. Amateur
Novice Amateur
Pony

19. RV PARKING: RV space fees are \$25.00 per day. Horse trailers parking in RV spaces will be charge the RV space fee. You can reserve a space with your stall reservation form.

20. RETURNED CHECKS: All returned checks will be charged \$35.00. Any exhibitor whose fees are non-negotiable will be reported to the Pinto Horse Association of America, Inc within 30 days of the close of the show (Rule 36H). In addition, the exhibitor/owner issuing a non-negotiable check will have 10 working days from the time of notification by Show Management of such check to make the check negotiable. If after 10 working days the check is still non-negotiable, exhibitor/owner will forfeit year-end points earned from the show. If after 10 working days the check is made negotiable, forfeited year-end points will not be reinstated from that show.

21. No staples or nails are to be used on the stalls or walls of any building.

22. Exhibitors/owners are responsible for cleaning up after their horses in the parking areas, around the outside buildings and in the aisles of the barn.

23. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor/owner to police the litter and garbage around their stall and camping area.
